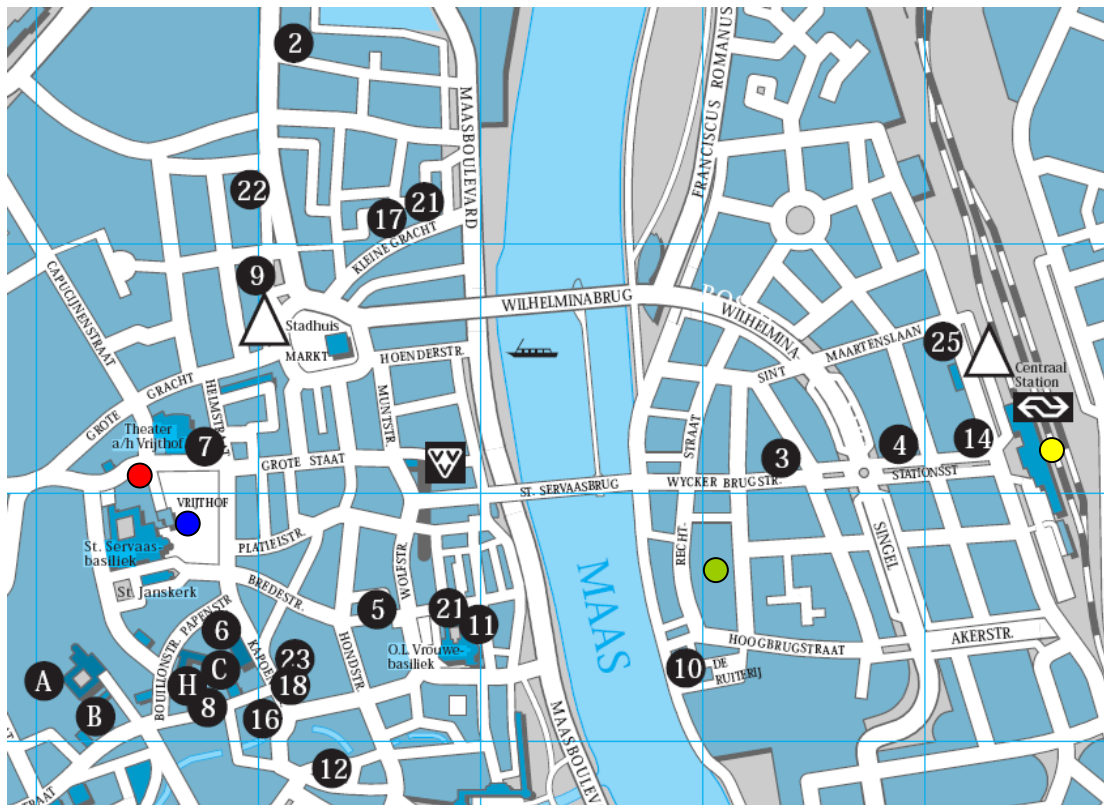

Number 2 Hotel Bastion, Boschstraat 27

Number 3 Hotel Beaumont, Wycker Brugstraat 2

Number 7 Hotel du Casque, Helmstraat 14

- **Groote Sociëteit, GRIN2007 venue, Vrijthof 36**
- Maastricht Central Train Station, Parallelweg
- Start informal activity, Saturday afternoon, Wycker Grachtstraat

Start and finish of city walk, Friday evening, Vrijthof

Train station to GRIN venue is ~1.5 km. / 15 min. walk

To the hotels by car:

For all hotels: From Heerlen-Aken (A79)/ Eindhoven (A2): You'll hit traffic lights once entering Maastricht on the motorway. Turn right at the first traffic lights (in the direction of Centrum-Wijk 11 to 23).

Bastion: You'll cross the Maas river after 1 km. Immediately on the bridge across the Maas, take the right lane. Then take the first turn to the right (Bastion Hotel Maastricht/Centrum is mentioned on the sign). At the T-junction you turn to the right again and you drive right on to the third traffic lights. Keep to the right and turn into the Boschstraat. After about 25 metres you will see the hotel on the left.

Du Casque: You'll cross the Maas river after 1 km. After bridge first lights to the left (direction Tongeren), first roundabout left (direction Tongeren). Take a left after 250 meters (Calveriestraat). You'll automatically arrive at Vrijthof where you'll see the hotel on the left (Helmstraat).

Beaumont: Turn left at the second lights (direction wijk 21) so do not cross the Maas river). Continue that road until a T-junction on a plateau, turn left there and take first right, then first left, you'll see the hotel after 100 mtr. on your right.
